What Was Said/Asked

- God: Why are you angry? Why is your face downcast? If you do what is right, will you not be accepted? But if you do not do what is right, sin is crouching at your door; it desires to have you, but you must rule over it.
- God: Where is your brother Abel?
- Cain: I don't know, am I my brother's keeper?
- God: What have you done? Listen! Your brother's blood cries out to me from the ground.
- God: Now you are under a curse and driven from the ground, which opened its mouth to receive your brother's blood from your hand. When you work the ground, it will no longer yield its crops for you. You will be a restless wanderer on the earth.
- Cain: My punishment is more than I can bear. Today you are driving me from the land, and I will be hidden from your presence; I will be a restless wanderer on the earth, and whoever finds me will kill me.
- God: Not so; anyone who kills Cain will suffer vengeance seven times over.


