## **Straight Talk**

Paul was not one to pull punches when talking to the churches he founded. In 2 Corinthians 8:7-15, Paul confronted the church at Corinth about their lack of follow through in contributing to the offering for needy believers.

We have attempted to make Paul's words a little blunter while keeping their original meaning. Below you will find a loose paraphrase of each of the nine verses of this text. Compare the paraphrases verse by verse, then assemble them in order. When you are done, you should have a very pointed paraphrase of 2 Corinthians 8:7-15!

Paraphrased verses (not in order):

Now it is time to put up or shut up.

Don't tell me you are broke. Just give what you can.

Last year, you made some big promises about your giving.

You think you are super Christians? Then show it by super generosity!

After all, isn't the essence of our faith that Jesus gave up everything for us?

Who knows? Those you help today may be the ones who will help you out tomorrow.

We are not trying to bleed you dry. We just want you to be generous with what you have.

Isn't it a basic economic principle that God gives us exactly what we need exactly when we need it?

Let's see how generous you are by comparing your giving with that of those who have far less than you do.
